While the program is successful in Port-Vila, we have difficulty to implement it in Santo due to lack of financial support from the Department of Youth and Sport. Despite several promises, the Department failed to provide the grant for this program and it has to be stopped in October. The Kindy Program continue to be a success.

One of the main focus of the development program for 2016 was the improvement of our Development Officers' training. Specific training session were conducted in May 2016 with Tennis World Coach Aymeric Mara and the main outcome was to have better structured lesson plan. Thank you to Tennis Australia who support this project.

SENIOR COMPETITION

Senior Competition was low this year with few players participating to the Fiji Open and the Oceania Championships. In the absence of Aymeric Mara and Cyril Jacobe, the task was difficult for Samuel Journet, Leiniker Thomas, Marlin Hannam, Lorraine Banimataku, Marie Liwuslili and Emma Maucotel who represented us at the Oceania Championships in Fiji.

Our Juniors took part to 3 regional events:
-The West Pacific Championships (Fiji),
- The Pacific Oceania Junior Championships (Fiji),
- The InterProvincial Games in New-Caledonia.

Our Juniors won the West-Pacific Championships for the third year and finished 3rd at the Oceania Junior Championships. Clement Mainguy won the U16 and Maui Leflon the U12. Rosalie Molbaleh finished 3rd in the U14. They all qualified to be part of a GSDF Tour in December 2016 and January 2017.

CYCLONE PAM REPAIR

In March 2015, Tropical Cyclone PAM destroyed the Cercle Sportif Tennis Club. The Vanuatu Tennis Federation obtained in April an exclusive management agreement for 10 years and work started to repair the badly damaged centre. All works planned to be done on the house have been completed in November 2016. Repairs work on the tennis courts should start in February 2017. The Tennis Centre officially became the Vanuatu National Tennis Centre in October.

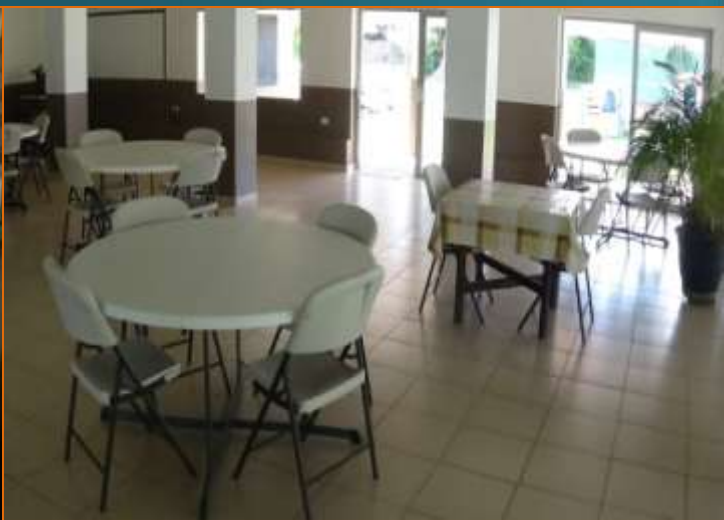

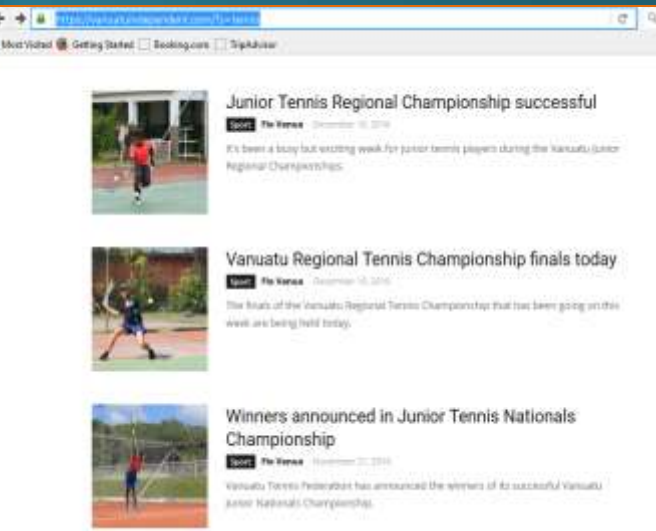




Our Federation manages the following social media accounts: Facebook, Twitter and YouTube.

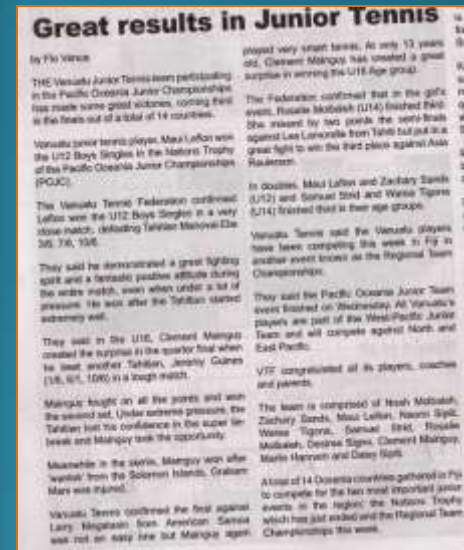
